


# Boundary Umpire Three Umpire System

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
## Start of game\quarter:

At the start of the game\quarter, Boundary Umpires 1 & 2 start on a corner, Boundary Umpire 3 starts 5-10m inside the Boundary Line, even with the end of the Centre Square. The shared side is always on the Coaches' Boxes side or grandstand side, unless weather conditions (i.e. wind) means that play will be mainly on the other side of the ground.




## Set shot on goal:

For a set shot on goal, the umpire running the side on their own (1) and the umpire closest to the goal on the shared side (2), need to make every effort to get behind the point post. The second umpire on the shared side (3) needs to stand 60 metres out from goal or behind where the player is taking the shot from (whichever is further), on the boundary line.



## Positioning after a point:

After a point has been scored, the Boundary Umpire on the side by themselves (1) backs out to the 50m as usual. On the side with two umpires, the umpire that was on the point post (2) only backs out to 25m from the post, ready for a possible short pass or turn over, while the other Boundary Umpire (3) on the double side is to back off so that they maintain a 50-60m distance between the two umpires.



## After a goal is scored:

After each goal, the two umpires that are doing the ball relay change sides. When doing this, the Boundary Umpire that has been on the side by themselves (1) is to do the long ball relay. The umpire that is changing to the side on their own (2) is to retrieve the ball and do the short ball relay. This is to give the umpire about to start the side on their own longer time to recover before the ball is thrown up. The other umpire on the shared side (3) will need to move so they are level with the end of the Centre Square, 5-10m inside the Boundary Line.
